2021 AMCA Int. Fan Shipments Data Collection

AMCA Int. is starting a data collection effort to characterize fan shipments in 2021. This data will help AMCA advocate for reasonable and realistic federal regulation and support incentive programs focused on more efficient fans.

Goals of this data collection

The 2021 shipment database will replace the 2012 database, which is out of date and which does not support the FEI metric. The 2021 database will enable AMCA to help:

- · Set reasonable and realistic efficiency requirements
- Accurately account for the impact of regulation on manufacturers
- Estimate the energy savings created through regulatory activity
- Support electrical utilities establish fan rebate programs

Data privacy and anonymity

What data do we need?

AMCA will be reaching out to request national sales data for fans manufactured in the United States or Canada and sold or shipped to the United States. The data request will include basic fan model information and details about the application and how the fan was equipped in the field.

AMCA takes data privacy and security seriously. All information will be collected through a third-party contractor under NDA, using industry standards for data aggregation and anonymization. No one except the third-party contractor will have access to the raw data.
